

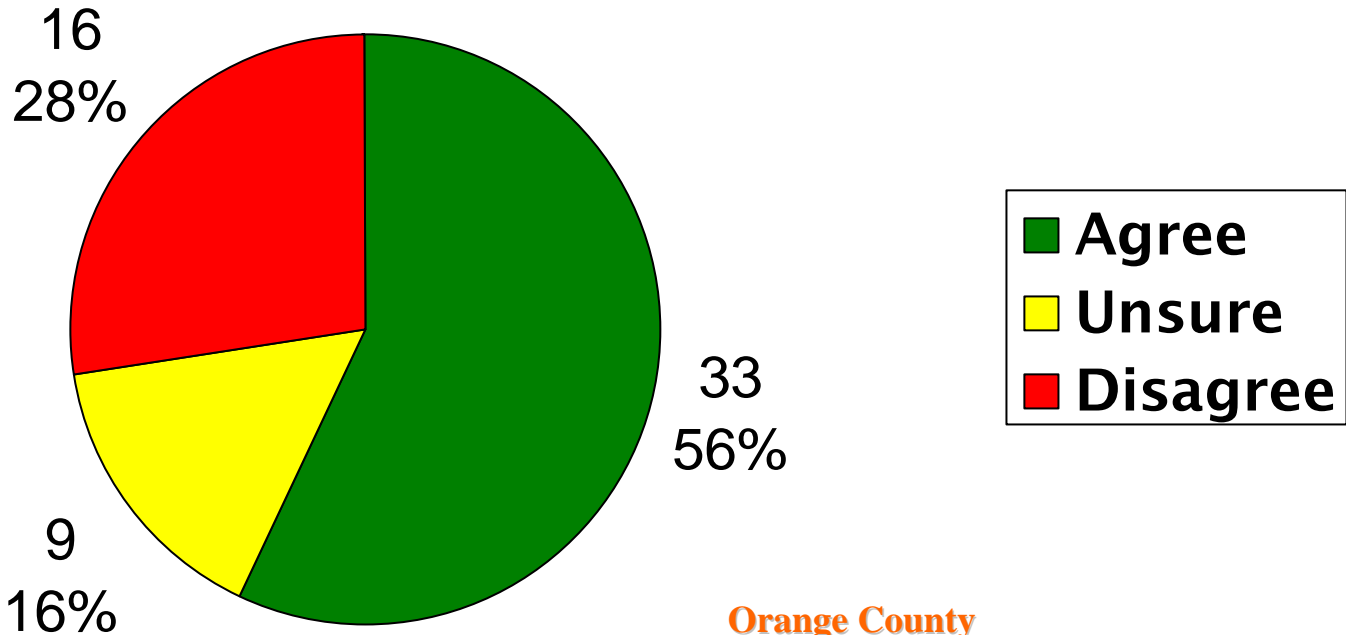

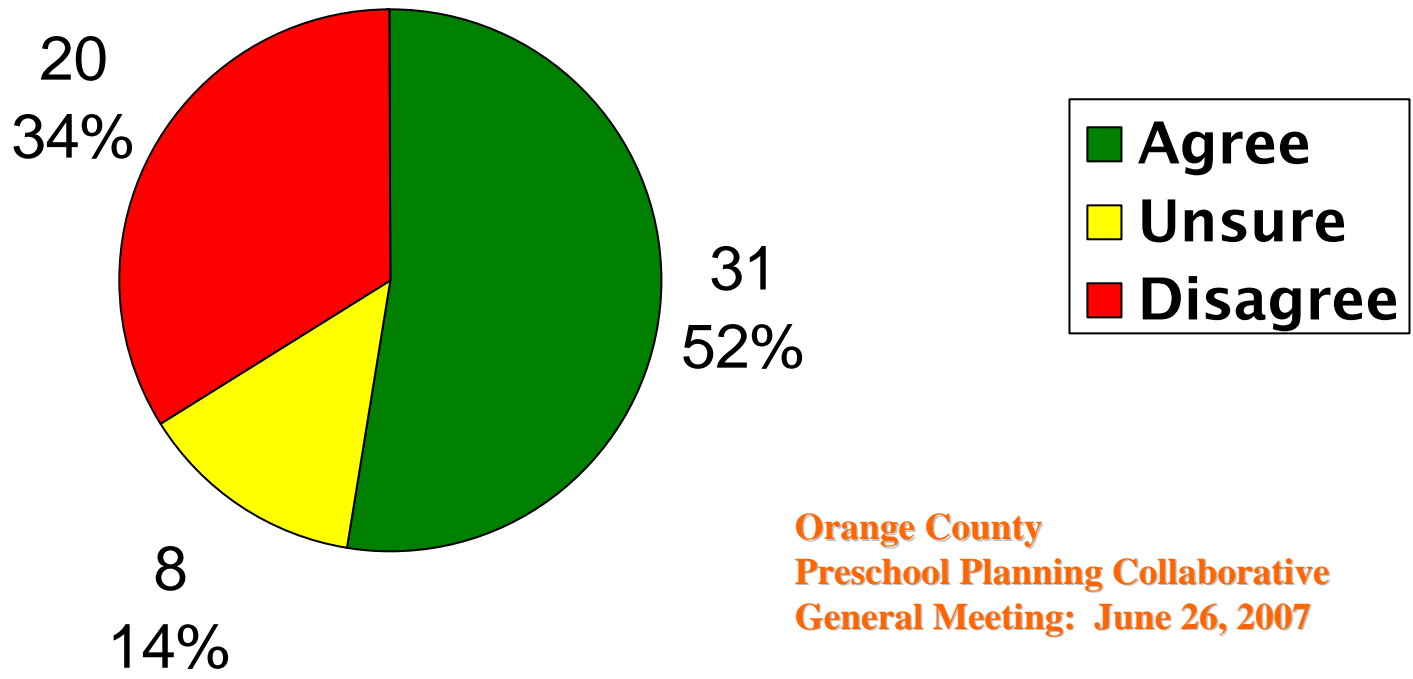
1. It would be an accomplishment to get all of our preschool programs to a comparable adequacy level before concentrating on developing showcase programs.

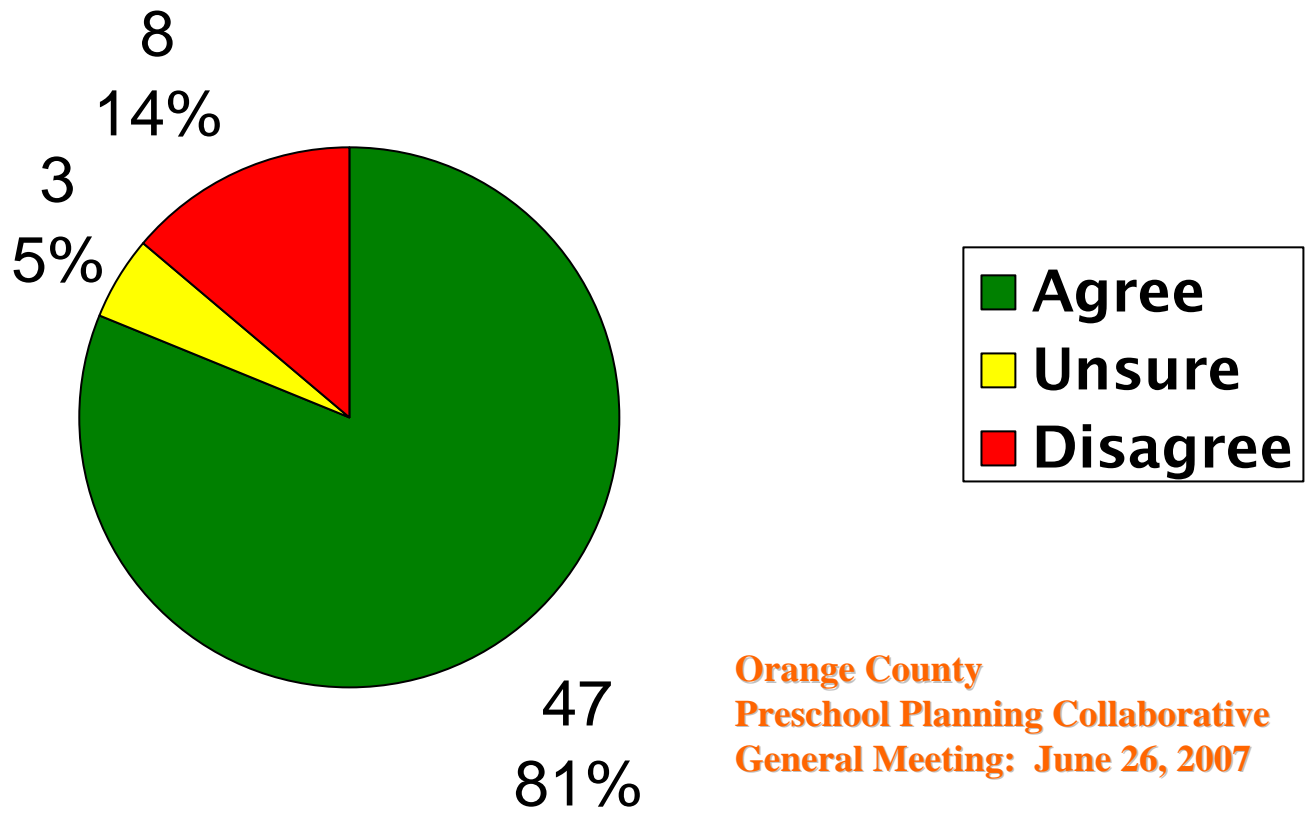

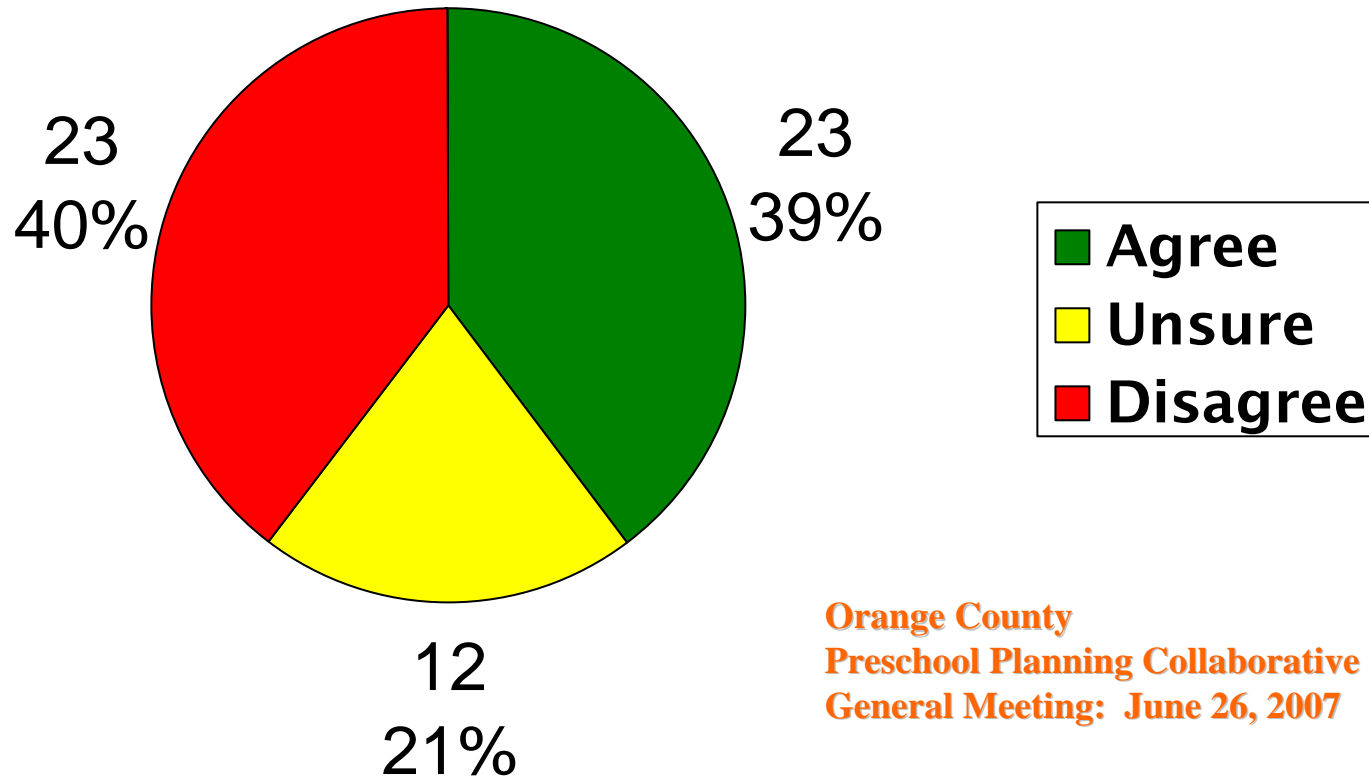

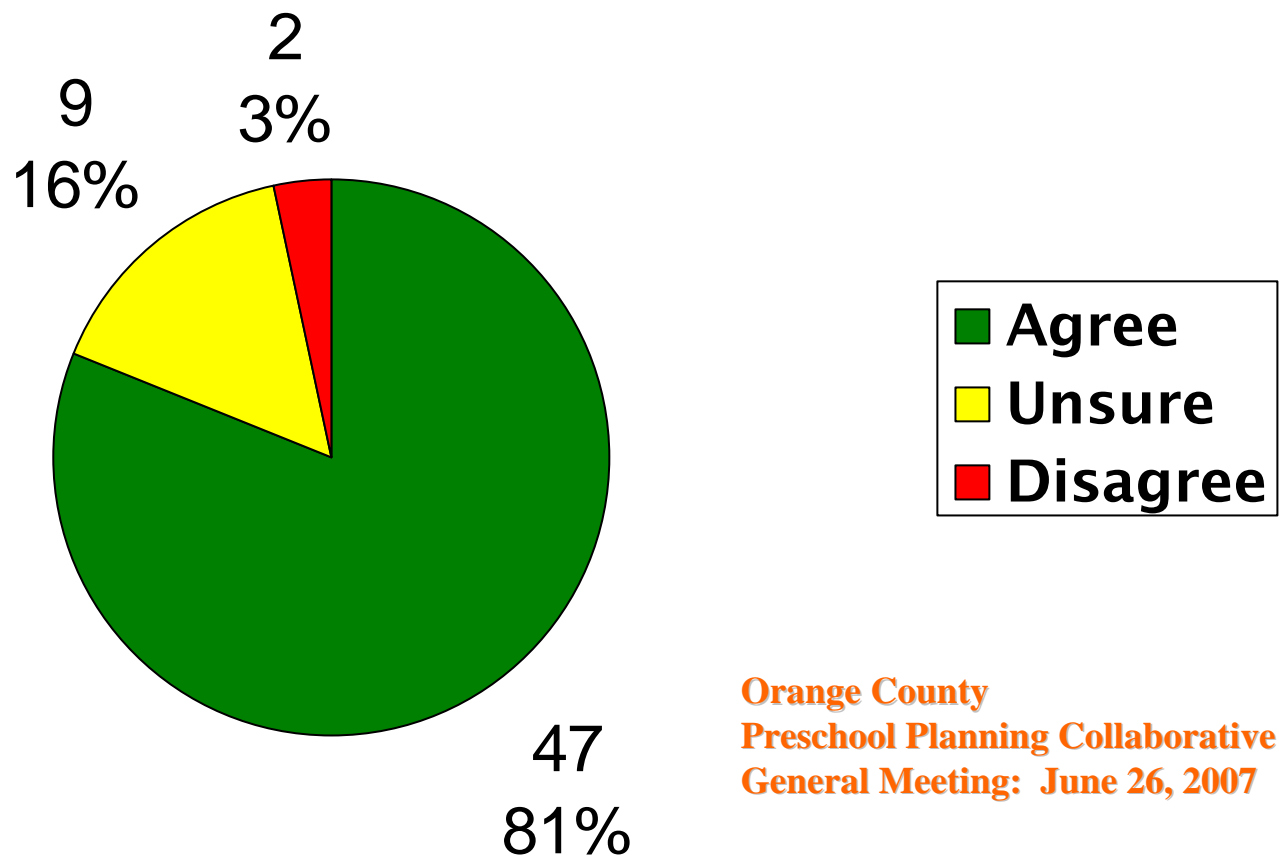
4. We have a duty to preserve the existing workforce before we rush to enact policies that require a BA degree for preschool teachers.

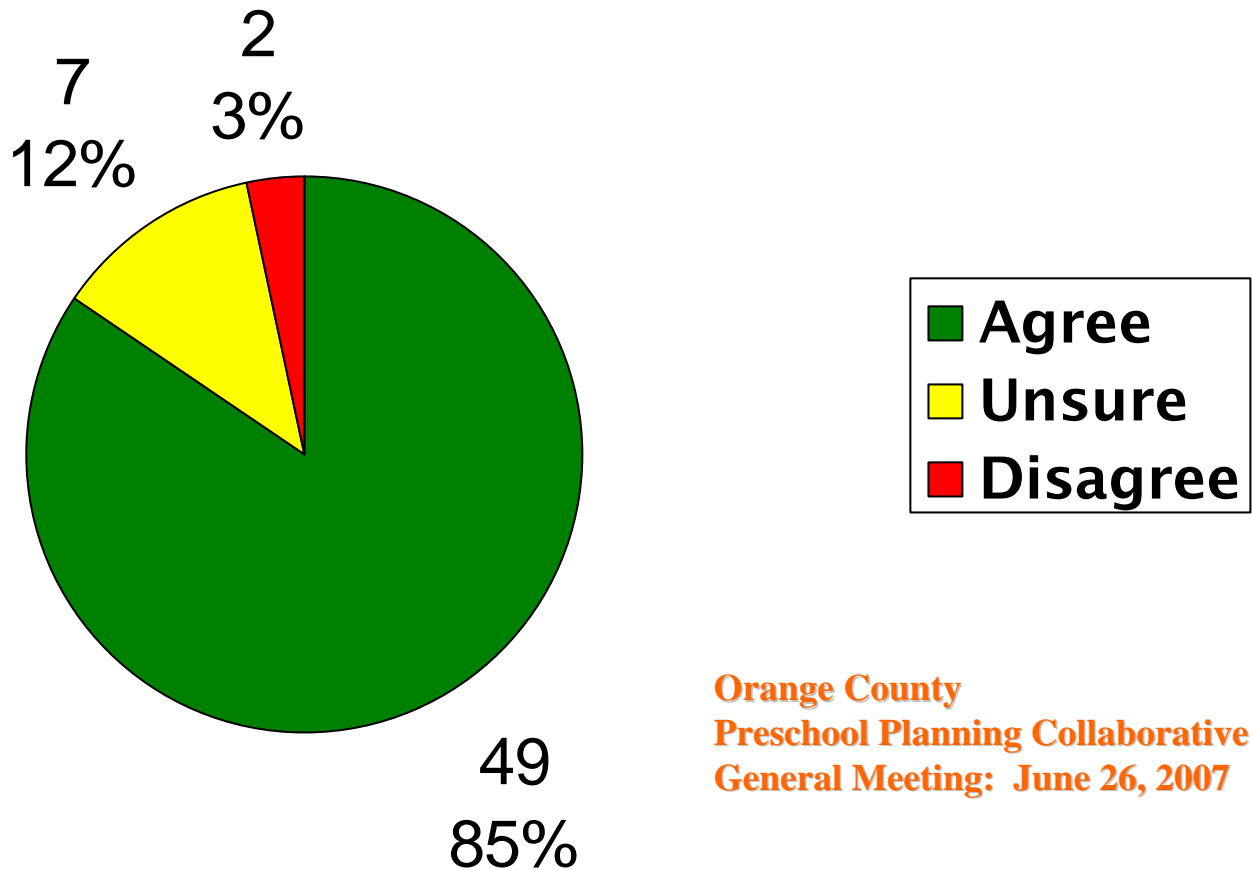

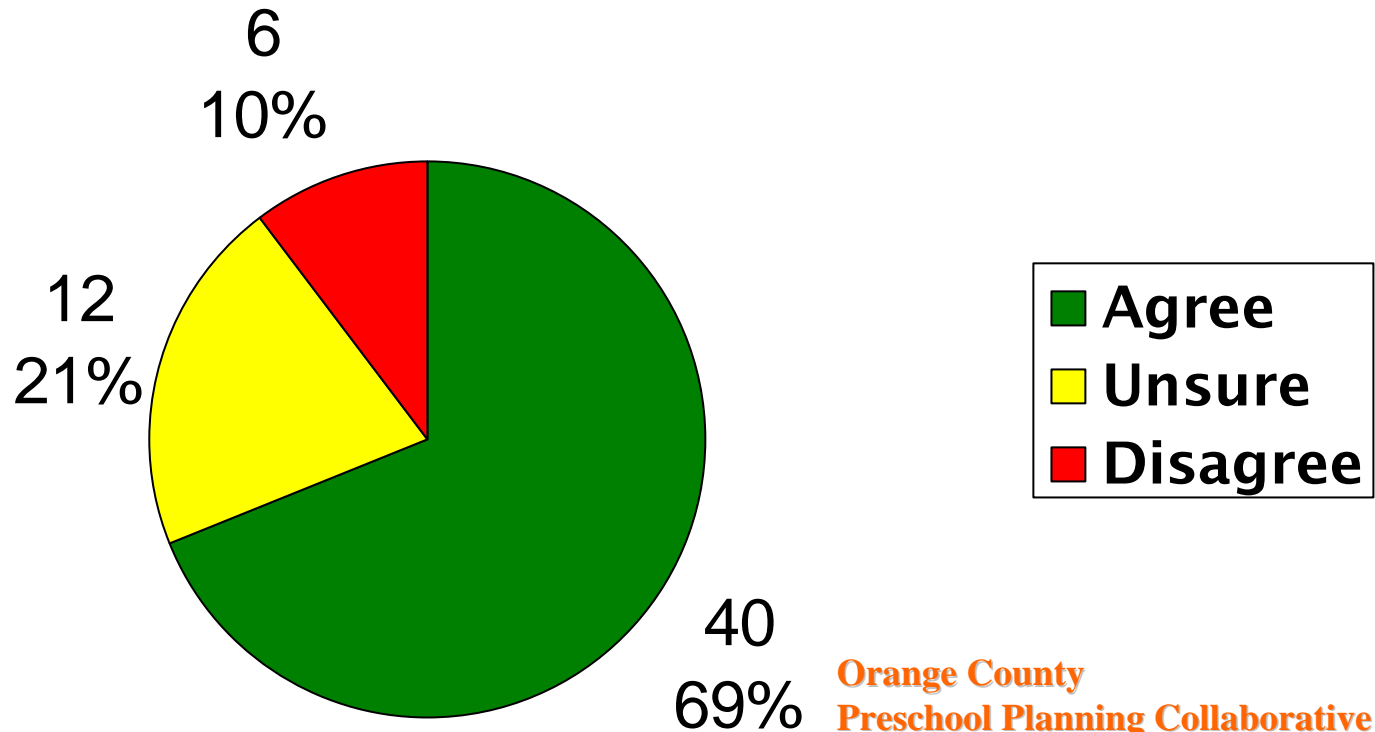


? 6. Having “Centers of Excellence” is an effective way to demonstrate why public investment in quality is worth the cost.
